

# The Australasian Obstetric General Anaesthesia for Caesarean Section Survey

## Plain Language Summary

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This study is collecting information about how general anaesthesia is currently used for caesarean sections across Australia and New Zealand. General anaesthesia (where patients are fully put to sleep) is used less often than regional anaesthesia (such as an epidural or spinal block) for caesarean sections, but it is sometimes necessary. Researchers want to understand current practice, identify complications, and find areas where care could be improved.

You may be eligible if:

- You are 18 years of age or older
- You are having an elective or emergency caesarean section under general anaesthesia between June 2005 and May 2006

You may NOT be eligible if:

- You are under 18 years of age

Talk to your doctor about whether this trial might be right for you.

## Key Eligibility Criteria

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### Inclusion (1)

- Patients undergoing elective or emergency caesarean section under general anaesthesia between 1.6.05 and 31.5.06.

### Exclusion (1)

- Parturients under 18 years of age.
