Plain Language Summary

This study assessed the motor development of premature babies using a specialised movement test called the Test of Infant Motor Performance (TIMP). It looks at how well premature newborns are moving and developing at the time they are discharged from hospital. Understanding which babies are at risk for developmental delays may help doctors and physiotherapists plan early support.

You may be eligible if:

- Your baby was born prematurely and is now clinically stable
- Your baby is breathing on their own
- Your baby's corrected age is up to 120 days

You may NOT be eligible if:

- Your baby has congenital malformations
- Your baby is currently on a mechanical ventilator or other breathing support

Talk to your doctor about whether this trial might be right for you.

Key Eligibility Criteria

Inclusion (1)

- premature stable newborn clinically with spontaneous breathing and age gestacional corrected of up to 120 days.

Exclusion (1)

- newborns with congenital malformations, mechanical ventilation or another ventilation support.
