Plain Language Summary

This study collects data from emergency departments (EDs) across Australia and New Zealand about how and when patients are placed on a breathing tube (intubation). Intubation in the ED is a high-risk procedure that has more complications than when done in an operating theatre. By tracking every intubation that happens across many EDs, researchers want to find out how often serious problems occur, what factors contribute to them, and how practice can be improved to make this life-saving procedure safer.

You may be eligible if:

- You require endotracheal intubation (placement of a breathing tube) in the emergency department
- You are of any age or sex

You may NOT be eligible if:

- There are no exclusion criteria for this study — all patients requiring intubation in the ED are eligible

Talk to your doctor about whether this trial might be right for you.

Inclusion (1)

- All patients requiring endotracheal intubation in the ED

Exclusion (1)

- None
