Plain Language Summary

When patients need to make decisions about their wisdom tooth treatment — such as whether to have them removed — having reliable health information can make a big difference. This study is testing whether guiding patients to high-quality, easy-to-understand online health resources helps them feel more informed and involved in the decision-making process, leading to better health and quality-of-life outcomes compared to receiving no guided internet health education.

You may be eligible if:

- You are between 18 and 39 years old
- You have been diagnosed with a wisdom tooth problem
- You use the internet
- You can understand and communicate in English
- You are otherwise fit and healthy

You may NOT be eligible if:

- You do not use the internet
- You have serious health problems
- You do not speak or read English

Talk to your doctor about whether this trial might be right for you.

Key Eligibility Criteria

Inclusion (1)

- Participants who have been diagnosed with wisdom teeth problems otherwise fit and healthy, aged 18-39 years, internet users, signed the informed consent

Exclusion (1)

- non internet user, have serious health problems, non English speakers.
