

# The Trial of Emergency Medicine Protocols In Simulation Training (TEMPIST) study

## Plain Language Summary

---

This study is testing a handbook of step-by-step emergency medical protocols to see whether using it during simulated medical emergencies helps doctors and nurses follow resuscitation guidelines more accurately. Medical staff will manage simulated scenarios — such as a child having a seizure or an adult in cardiac arrest — with or without the handbook, and researchers will measure how correctly each task is performed.

You may be eligible if:

- You are a doctor or nurse aged 18 or older
- You have worked in an Australian Emergency Department within the last 12 months
- You are attending a resuscitation training course or volunteering your time

You may NOT be eligible if:

- You are a nursing or medical student
- You are a member of the study team

Talk to your doctor about whether this trial might be right for you.

## Key Eligibility Criteria

---

### Inclusion (3)

- Doctors and Nurses from the Local Health District who are already attending resuscitation training courses at the UCRH or volunteer to participate in their own time. It is anticipated that groups will vary in their preexisting skill level and level of experience.
- Recruited staff will need to have worked within an Australian Emergency Department within the last 12 months.
- Age 18 or above.

### Exclusion (2)

- Nursing and Medical Students will be excluded from the trial.
- Study personnel will be excluded.
