Plain Language Summary

This study in Kelantan, Malaysia is evaluating a new educational program called RaHEM (Rabies Health Education Module) designed to improve knowledge and attitudes about rabies among dog owners. Rabies is a deadly viral disease transmitted through animal bites, and dog owners are an important group to reach with accurate information about prevention and responsible pet ownership.

Participants will be randomly assigned to either receive the RaHEM educational module or serve as a comparison group. Knowledge and attitudes will be assessed using a questionnaire one month after the intervention to see whether the program made a meaningful difference.

You may be eligible if you are 18 years or older, own at least one dog at home, have reliable internet access, and can understand English or Malay. You would not be eligible if you already participated in an earlier phase of this study.

Key Eligibility Criteria

Inclusion (1)

- Individual aged 18 and above, owned at least one dog at home and has a good coverage of internet.

Exclusion (1)

- Individuals who unable to understand either English or Malay language fluent or already participate in phase II validation study.

Locations (1 total)

Kelantan, Malaysia
