

# Linking Education, Produce Provision, and Community Referrals to Improve Diabetes Care (LINK)

## Plain Language Summary

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The LINK study is testing whether combining diabetes education, free healthy food (produce), and connections to community resources can help people with type 2 diabetes who face food insecurity better manage their blood sugar.

**\*\*You may be eligible if...\*\***

- You have been diagnosed with type 2 diabetes
- Your HbA1c (a 3-month blood sugar average) is 7.5% or higher, meaning your diabetes is not well-controlled
- You have screened positive for food insecurity (difficulty affording enough food)

**\*\*You may NOT be eligible if...\*\***

- You are unwilling to allow the study team to share information with the Mid-Ohio Food Collective, a food assistance partner

Talk to your doctor to see if this trial is right for you.

## Key Eligibility Criteria

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### Inclusion (3)

- Type 2 Diabetes based on American Diabetes Association Criteria
- Hemoglobin A1c e 7.5%
- Screen Positive on 2-item Food Security Screener

### Exclusion (1)

- Unwilling to Attest to Release of Information to Mid-Ohio Food Collective
