Plain Language Summary

This pilot study tests whether a health advocate program — using a trained peer or professional to support families navigating post-transplant care — can improve outcomes and reduce disparities for children who have received a liver transplant.

****You may be eligible if...****

- Your child (under 18) has received a liver transplant
- You (as parent or guardian) are willing to participate and can be contacted for follow-up
- You speak English or Spanish
- You live in the United States

****You may NOT be eligible if...****

- The caregiver is unwilling or unable to complete the study surveys
- The child is a ward of the state (e.g., in foster care)
- You do not speak English or Spanish
- Your child is 18 or older at enrollment

Talk to your doctor to see if this trial is right for you.

Key Eligibility Criteria

Inclusion (4)

- Patients under 18 years of age that have undergone liver transplantation.
- Subject and/or parent/legal guardian can provide written informed consent and willing to comply with study procedures.
- Subject and/or parent/ legal guardian is willing to be contacted in the future by study staff.
- Patient and/or caregiver felt to be a good fit for this pilot by transplant team.

Exclusion (5)

- Caregiver unwilling or unable to complete the survey.
- Child is a ward of the state (e.g. foster care) since present circumstances may not be reflective of child's past or future circumstances.
- Non-English, non-Spanish speakers.
- Non-US residents.
- Greater than 18 years of age at the time of enrollment.
