## Plain Language Summary

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This study is developing and testing a survivorship care program (POSTCARE-O) for women who have completed initial treatment for ovarian cancer. The goal is to help women transition from active treatment to life after cancer, addressing ongoing needs like monitoring, side effects, and emotional well-being.

**\*\*You may be eligible if...\*\***

- You have Stage 2–4 ovarian cancer
- You have been treated with some combination of surgery, chemotherapy, or other therapies
- You completed your initial treatment within the past 6 months (ongoing maintenance therapy is still okay)
- You can provide consent in English or Spanish

**\*\*You may NOT be eligible if...\*\***

- You have been enrolled in hospice care following your ovarian cancer treatment

Talk to your doctor to see if this trial is right for you.

## Key Eligibility Criteria

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### Inclusion (4)

- Stage 2-4 ovarian cancer
- Treated with some combination of surgery, chemotherapy, biologics, maintenance therapy
- Within 6 months of completion of initial treatment (continued maintenance therapy okay)
- Able to provide consent in English or Spanish

### Exclusion (1)

- Admission to hospice at the completion of treatment for ovary cancer
