

# Evaluation of Early Home Return in Patients With Enucleation of Prostate Adenoma

## Plain Language Summary

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This study is examining whether patients who have an enlarged prostate removed using laser surgery can safely go home earlier than the current standard, without an increase in complications.

**\*\*You may be eligible if...\*\***

- You are scheduled for laser surgery to remove prostate tissue (endoscopic enucleation)
- You have an enlarged prostate causing urinary symptoms that have not responded to medication
- Or you have complications like urine retention, bladder stones, or kidney problems caused by the prostate

**\*\*You may NOT be eligible if...\*\***

- You have had previous prostate surgery
- You are taking blood thinners that cannot be safely stopped before surgery
- You have a prostate cancer diagnosis

Talk to your doctor to see if this trial is right for you.

## Key Eligibility Criteria

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### Inclusion (5)

- Patient planned for endoscopic enucleation of prostate adenoma with laser
- Patient with symptomatic benign prostatic hyperplasia and refractory to medical treatment and/or
- Patient with benign prostatic hyperplasia complicated by chronic retention of urine and/or
- Patient with benign prostatic hyperplasia complicated by prostatitis and/or
- Patient with symptomatic benign prostatic hyperplasia

### Exclusion (4)

- Patient living beyond the scope of care by the nurses coordination
- Bedridden patient or WHO clinical condition  $\geq 2$
- Patient requiring curative anticoagulation which cannot be interrupted or relayed at home by heparin
- Patient with double anti-platelet aggregation who cannot be interrupted
