Plain Language Summary

This program is studying whether delivering blood transfusions at home — rather than in a clinic or hospital — is feasible, safe, and preferred by people with advanced blood cancers who need regular transfusions near the end of life.

****You may be eligible if...****

- You are 18 or older
- You have a relapsed or treatment-resistant blood cancer
- You receive your primary blood cancer care at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute
- You have already had at least one red blood cell or platelet transfusion without a serious reaction
- Your doctor estimates you have six months or less to live
- You live within the service area of Care Dimensions Hospice
- Family caregivers of eligible patients may also participate

****You may NOT be eligible if...****

- You are already enrolled in hospice
- You live in a nursing home or assisted living facility
- You have had a previous serious adverse reaction to a blood transfusion
- You are under 18 years old

Talk to your doctor to see if this trial is right for you.

Key Eligibility Criteria

Inclusion (8)

- Diagnosis of a relapsed/refractory hematologic malignancy
- Age ≥ 18 years
- Receipt of primary oncologic care at DFCI (at least 2 outpatient visits in 12 months prior to enrollment)
- Has received at least one red blood cell (RBC) or platelet transfusion since blood cancer diagnosis in the clinic or hospital setting without a severe transfusion reaction
- Patient resides within catchment served by Care Dimensions Hospice
- ... and 3 more (see full listing online)

Exclusion (5)

- Age < 18 years
- Already enrolled in hospice
- Resides in nursing home or assisted living facility
- History of previous serious adverse transfusion reaction
- Age < 18 years
